NWM is fully committed to our role in safeguarding staff, service users and stakeholders from becoming radicalised and being drawn into forms of terrorism. NWM serves to promote the welfare of all its Staff, service users and stakeholders and recognise that safeguarding against radicalisation is as important as safeguarding against any other vulnerability. All staff are expected to uphold and promote the fundamental principles of British values, including democracy, the rule of law, individual liberty and mutual respect, and tolerance of those with different faiths and beliefs. We believe that everyone should be given the opportunity to explore diversity and understand Britain as a multi-cultural society; everyone should be treated with respect whatever their race, gender, sexuality, religious belief, special need, or disability. As part of our commitment to safeguarding we fully support the government's Prevent Strategy.

NWM has a comprehensive Safeguarding & Vulnerable peoples' Policy with clear procedures which are reviewed annually. Staff are trained to maintain a culture of vigilance and all staff, are required to undertake disclosure and barring service (DBS) checks, when needed.

Our approach is to integrate our Prevent Duties within:

- good teaching and learning and delivery of projects
- promoting our values, mission and purpose
- ensuring that equality, diversity and inclusion are embedded in everything we do.
- encouraging those we work with to become active citizens and contribute to their communities.
